Dental Hygiene

On Thursday, the children in Years 1 and 2 (Woodpeckers, Kingfishers and Swallows) will be attending an assembly led by a dental nurse and actor. The children will be reminded about the importance of looking after their teeth by cleaning them at least twice a day for two minutes each time, not eating too many sugary foods and visiting the dentist regularly. This is being paid for by Public Health Blackburn as unfortunately Blackburn has one of the worst rates of child tooth decay in the country.

Children in Years 1 and 2 will bring home a copy of a book that will be shared in this assembly – 'Max's Not So Sweet Dream' – and I would encourage parents and carers of children in Years 1 and 2 to re-read this book with your child to reinforce the very important messages it contains.

Recent Snow and Icy Weather

I would like to thank all parents and carers for their understanding last Tuesday when the decision was made to open the school at 1.00pm. The road conditions around school were very dangerous in the morning, as they were in many areas outside of Blackburn where many of our school staff live. Opening in the afternoon meant that everyone was able to travel in much safer conditions.

I have had conversations with a couple of parents about asking BwD to provide additional grit bins for Cambridge Street and the path that connects Withers Street with Chester Street. For BwD to do this, local residents have to be willing to form a 'Community Grit Squad'. A minimum of 3 residents are needed to sign up to create a 'Community Grit Squad'. BwD require all applicants to confirm they will complete the mandatory training and collect all materials and equipment from the address provided. If you are interested in forming a Community Grit Squad, please let me know.

A big thank you to Mr Orange, our Site Supervisor, for the fantastic job he did in clearing the paths and car park for everyone.
