School Meals

All meals should be ordered and **paid for** in advance – this can be done up to the day before. **We are unable to allow children to have a meal without payment in advance.** We recognise that there will sometimes be the odd occasion when this might not be possible and of course we will do our best to accommodate these occasional requests.

Anti-Bullying Week 2024

This week is the national anti-bullying week. In our assembly today, children were reminded of the definition of bullying:

'The repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power'. Bullying can be physical or verbal. It can happen face to face or online.

This year's anti-bullying week theme is 'Choose respect'. The aim is to empower children and young people to not resort to bullying, even when they disagree and remind adults to lead by example, online and offline.

Imagine a world where respect and kindness thrives – it's not just a dream, it's in the choices we make.

Children were once again encouraged to 'make a noise about bullying' – in other words, to tell an adult in school if they see this happening to themselves or anyone else. If something is happening to them and we don't know about it, we can't do anything to help.
