We want our children to live fulfilled and happy lives.


Walk in obedience to all that the LORD your God has commanded you, so that you may live and prosper. Deuteronomy 5:33

Teach me knowledge and good judgement, for I trust your commands. Psalm 119:66



Our School Values




We have 12 Christian Bible Values. These are focused on in a two year rolling cycle (one value per half term):

Year 1: Thankfulness, Trust, Compassion, Forgiveness, Hope, Endurance



Year 2: Generosity, Friendship, Courage, Service, Respect, Honesty



Children and staff are encouraged to spot other children displaying these values. Children who are 'caught' displaying these values have their names put in a box. Names are drawn out of the box during Friday's Achievement Assembly and these children receive recognition and a small prize. Their names are also included in the weekly newsletter.
